Thought for the Month



As I write, the news remains relentlessly worrying; and since we are now so globally interconnected, we know that what happens in China, Ukraine or the Amazon will have its effects everywhere sooner or later (and we see it already in our fuel and heating bills). I expect there to be several Ukrainian families living in our villages before long and I hope they will find the warmest of welcomes among us. Certainly, churches locally are pooling resources to offer as much support as possible. We are all in this together and I am sure that calls on our kindness and generosity toward each other (local or global) will not be stopping any time soon.

Christian Aid week (15-21 May) focusses on drought caused by climate change. The people of Zimbabwe feel the effects of climate change, of Covid and of steeply rising food and fertiliser prices following the war on Ukraine; so many families will be unable to grow enough food to feed their children. This month they, like so many other excellent charities will also be calling on our generosity. Websters Dictionary informs me that to hope is to 'cherish a desire with anticipation'. By this definition, people who work for Christian Aid are surely motivated by hope; hope for a world where resources are more fairly spread, where climate is stable and where people are not hungry. They work to make that hope real wherever they find need.



Hope is also the motivator behind the ten days set aside for prayer at the end of May where we join with churches all round the world to pray 'Thy Kingdom Come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven'. Keep giving, keep praying. 'With every gift, every action, every prayer, we celebrate and share hope with our sisters and brothers around the world, from Ukraine to Zimbabwe'.

Church News

May is an exciting month for Holy Trinity in our search for a new vicar. On 3 May, the interview panel with representatives from Seer Green and Jordans, Chalfont St Giles, Amersham Deanery and Oxford Diocese will meet to shortlist the candidates who have applied for our part-time job. 17 May will be a very busy interview day for a maximum of 3 candidates. Each of them will give a short talk in a Morning Prayer service at Holy Trinity, lead an assembly at Seer Green Church of England School, face the interview panel for an hour, and hopefully have a more relaxing time as they meet the Benefice clergy, and tour our villages and the Vicarage. If all goes well, we expect to be able to announce who will be our new vicar.

Our Annual Parochial Council Meeting will be held on 23 May on Zoom. This is when the members of the church, called the Electoral Roll, have an opportunity to review the audited financial statement and the activities of the church during the previous 12 months. The Electoral Roll are those whose applications having been received by the Electoral Roll officer, Heather Rowe, and have been added to the Roll.

We are not due a complete revision this year so it will be amended by Heather, removing those who have moved away, and adding those who apply and fulfil the criteria. You can only vote at the APCM if you are on the electoral roll. Churchwardens and new members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) are also nominated and confirmed.

We also hope to be well underway in planning for our 175th birthday on Trinity Sunday 12 June. Save the date as we'd love to celebrate with you. Any help will be appreciated, no matter how small. Please contact the church wardens Janine Dunnell or Jane Spoerry. Contact details on Page 4.

Christian Aid

Christian aid exists to create a world where everyone can live a full life, free from poverty.

For Christian Aid Week 'We're raising our voices to call for climate justice. Together, we can restore justice to our world.'



Jessica's story

In Zimbabwe, the climate crisis is causing hunger for families like Jessica's. The combined effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, conflict, and drought have robbed her of the power to provide for her children. 7000 miles away, the war in Ukraine will drive up food prices in Zimbabwe and around the globe.

Without the fertiliser and food-like wheat and cooking oil- that Ukraine and Russia produce. Vulnerable families will be pushed even deeper into hunger. Like many women in rural Zimbabwe - 7 out of 10 rely on farming for income and food - Jessica toils on her farm, but nothing can grow on her ashen, dry land. Drought starves. Intensified by the climate crisis, and the effects of war in Ukraine on global food production, it drives families into hunger.

Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal

'We're working with 3 partner organisations in the ACT Alliance; Hungarian Interchurch Aid (HIA) in Ukraine and Hungary, the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) in Poland, and Swiss Church Aid (HEKS) in Ukraine, Hungary and Romania, to offer assistance to internally displaced peoples and to refugees.



Natalia's story

Natalia, Igor, 9, and baby girl Nastia, 2 months, are the first family to stay in a shelter supported by our partner Hungarian Interchurch Aid in Lviv. Nastia is also the youngest internally displaced person there. Natalia and her children arrived by bus. The family comes from the Kyiv region. Natalia's husband is in the army.

'Our village was destroyed. There was bombing every day. I feared for my family. I'm afraid for my husband.'



• Fill gaps in your borders by sowing annuals straight into the soil, cosmos and calendula work well.




- · Plant runner beans, tomatoes, herbs, beetroot etc. amongst your flowers.



I'd like to thank all those who attended the meeting in the Village Hall. We are now setting up a working group to explore what the village and JVL can do to reduce carbon emissions and protect nature.

Some people have already shown interest in being involved and if there are any others, please contact me if you'd like to get involved. The working group will be developing an action plan for the village and we welcome input from as many people as possible. It will also be a place to empower and encourage people to come with ideas and initiatives so we can be an enabler and catalyst for climate related projects to flourish.

The Village Store is keen to do more but needs feedback and support from the community. A rewilding group has formed to explore improving biodiversity on village land. There are already things happening but there is so much more we can do.

Many villages have declared climate emergencies. In talking to councillors from some of those villages, they have regularly come up against red tape and restrictions, primarily because the public land or council houses are owned by different public authorities. They all said that Jordans is in an unique position because it owns so much land and property. Their question was why weren't we doing this already? Jordans could become an example to other villages as to what could be possible. It seems the gauntlet has been laid down for us to take up!

Sankofa is the story of Anna Bain a mixed-race British woman who at 48 years old, following her mothers' death, discovers that her father, Francis Aggrey, a man she never knew is alive and living in Bamana in West Africa, and what is more, has been a controversial political dictator there.

She gets a glimpse of who he was by reading the diaries he left with her mother before he left England for Africa and feels an affinity with him through the pages.

Going through a divorce and with a distant only child. Anna decides to travel to Bamana on her own and meet the father she never got the chance to know whilst getting to know herself.

Written in the first person, this novel explores race. belonging, identity, and different forms of power.

The name May is the modern-day English form of the Latin word *Maius*, which has origins going back to the time of the ancient Greeks. May (or Maius) was named after the Greek goddess of growth.

It was called Tri-Milchi by the Anglo Saxons for the knowledge that lush, green grass and longer days led to being able to milk cows three times a day!

May actually has two birth flowers - the Lily-of-the-Valley and the Hawthorn. The Hawthorn flower is a symbol of hope, while the Lily-ofthe-Valley represents the return of happiness and sweetness.

It is a pretty unique month as during any given year no other month will start and end with the same days that May does.

West Wycombe and Bradenham



A nice walk through woods and along ridges with lots of historic context

Length: 7 ¾ miles

Start point: West Wycombe car park

Difficulty: Moderate

A longer walk this month of nearly 8 miles but with a good refreshment stop after 5 miles! The starting point is the National Trust Car Park on Chorley Road near West Wycombe. From there cross the road and bear left up the hill on a footpath. Continue until you meet the large track that leads to the hill top (which you visit later) and turn left along the ridge.

Follow the track for about 1½ miles and after a downhill section it comes out on a lane where you turn right. Follow the lane past Saunderton Station and over the A4010 continuing up the lane to Small Dean Farm. Turn right on

a footpath to the corner of a wood then bear right and follow the edge of the wood, eventually crossing fields and coming out on Bradenham Wood Lane. Turn right and head down to the junction with the A4010 and the Red Lion cafe (which also serves drinks!).

After leaving the cafe, re-trace your steps and turn right on a minor road, then left onto a footpath up the hill skirting the seventeenth century Bradenham Manor which is on your left. The path goes into woodland then levels out and eventually goes quite steeply downhill to the railway bridge. Last time I was here the footbridge was closed and a short diversion was needed to the right and then along the A4010 footpath for a short while. Either way take the footpath on the far side of the road up the hill and across the field to a narrow road where you turn right up to the church and mausoleum car park.

These were originally part of the Dashwood Estate and the golden globe above the church was reputed to be a venue for the infamous drinking society founded by Sir Francis Dashwood – the Hellfire Club. There are wonderful views from the top of the hill of the surrounding Chilterns and of West Wycombe House across the valley behind the village. After exploring the area head down the other side of the hill to the car park to finish the walk.

Eight O'Clock Club: Game of Stones!

Many a villager has waged war to gain control of a flowerbed by sieving the soil get rid of the stones! Whilst the result may be pleasing for a while, the stones and flints keep rising to the surface, and the earth returns to how it looked before all that time and toil.

This is a perfect example of learning to work with the natural world and not against it! As geologist and archaeologist Dr Jill Eyers explained, our gardens are the product of plant material, water, oxygen and rock from a few million years ago. Geologically speaking, the Chiltern Hills are mere youngsters, and the main shaping only took place half a million years ago, when we were in the grip of a massive ice sheet and our gardens were under the ice.

Our gardens have experienced cycles of global warmings and periods of intense cold. Seas have risen and fallen, providing perfect conditions for coccoliths that created the chalk. A staircase of river terraces was formed from the ancestral River Thames which was much wider than today and followed a different course. Our gardens sit on "Beaconsfield Gravel": clay with flint. We see chalk, sand, muddy sediment, silty clay deposits and shiny particles of quartz in the flint. Stones are angular or rounded, being worked and re-worked over long periods of time.

There is a story under our feet that can be explored through free apps downloaded to a phone, such as the British Geological Survey app "iGeology", but even just observing stones with the naked eye can reveal marks of cross-stratification.

Geology helps us understand our gardens and the forces of nature that shaped them.



Tweet of the Month for April

Aerial Manoeuvres over Seer Green

Watching the skies for enemy action is, thankfully, just WWII history for Seer Green and Jordans - if you're human. For birds, life is not so tranquil.

Kites and buzzards fill up on rodents, earthworms and carrion, but will gladly take the eggs and chicks of other birds if they can. Crows are territorial and aggressive and will try to drive these predators out of their airspace, in a behaviour known as 'mobbing', sometimes carried out singly, sometimes in a gang.

Thus the stage is set for the drama that unfolded over Farmers Way in mid-March, with a daring crow, *Corvus corone*, diving and feinting at a squealing red kite, *Milvus milvus*. Neither bird wants to incur injury in these situations, so the crow was avoiding the kite's talons and the kite was giving ground, as the pair vanished over the rooftops.

Moments later, the kite reappeared and was joined by its mate, both exchanging their wild keening calls. They soared round the green in interlocking arcs, calling to one another, diving at times to within two or three meters of the ground, and performing synchronous flying manoeuvres, in a mating season display - this time undisturbed by indignant crows.

Of course, our grandparents watching the skies during the war were unlikely to see a kite: they'd been extinct in England since 1871, until reintroduced to the Chilterns in 1989, followed by similar initiatives in the north.

I often see a kite perched in the oak in One Tree Field, surveying the scene, forked tail hanging down; and a nest in Green Woods is sometimes visited by a pair in spring. It's not clear if young have ever been raised there, but I've no doubt kites nest in Hodgemoor and other local woodland.






